29 WEEK TRAINING COURSE OFFERED BY FORD-SHELBY DEALERS

Ford and Ford/Shelby dealers across the mation are offering a 29 week training program for automobile mechanics. This is to fill the ever-growing need created by the over 7 million new car sales per year.

According to the Ford Division National Service Manager, E. P. Williams, Ford dealers alone need 3,000 new mechanics this year and an additional 3,000 each year through 1970.

There are 14 training schools in the country. The Los Angeles school is located at 10100 Greenleaf Avenue, Santa Fe Springs, California. To participate in the program, a trainee should apply at the Ford dealer of his choice (there are over 6,000 nationally). Once employed, the trainee is paid by the dealer who sponsors him at the training. During the 29 weeks of the program, 8 weeks are spent in session at the training school, the other 21 weeks are on the job. Two of the 8 weeks in class are instructed by Shelby hi-performance instructors, Carroll Smith, John Dunn, and Steele Therkleson.

To qualify as a trainee in this program, applicants should "sell" himself to the dealer, show an aptitude for the profession, and a real interest in the exciting field of automobile mechanics.

Lew Spencer, also driving a Cobra, was the first to finish, but "Ole Leadfoot" had travelled too fast to win.
